# Sunday, 9 Dec 2018: Second Sunday of Advent - Year C

Do we have to be like John the Baptist, eccentrically dressed and scavenging for food, to prepare the way of the Lord? No. You and I are called to be a John or Joan the Baptist, preparing people's hearts in our own time and place.

But we have to allow God to prepare *our* hearts for this role. John the Baptist challenges us to 'Repent', i.e. to turn around our own lives seeking God's forgiveness. John then challenges us to see the big picture which is that 'All who live shall see the salvation of God'.

Pope Francis is the exemplary universal pastor inspiring us to become 'les mercifuls sans frontieres'. And young people through social media are already saying 'We are one community of human beings on this fragile planet'.

The challenge for most of us is more immediate and apparently of smaller scope. The challenge this Advent is to identify the one person whose heart you can help prepare to celebrate the coming of the Lord Jesus in three weeks' time. The best method is to let that person see your faith and joy centred on that little Jewish baby lying in a manger.

Do that, and who knows what may happen because that little baby is in fact the Sovereign Lord of history and of the whole cosmos. With God's grace, you don't have to be as eccentric or bizarre as John the Baptist to play your part in changing the course of history!

We could take a moment to pray that, repenting of our own sins where necessary, we may prepare the heart of at least one person so that the Lord Jesus may enter in this Christmas, helping him fulfil his mission that all who live shall see the salvation of God.

#### <u>School Zone Reminder</u>

A reminder to all our parents ahead of the Christmas holiday break at the end of Term 4, that school zones remain in place for the safety of our children and families. School zones operate on all gazetted schools days, which are all days the school is open, even pupil free days/Staff Development Days. Most NSW Catholic Schools school zones operate as normal until (and include) Thursday, 20th and Friday 21st December 2018 and resume on Tuesday, 29th January 2019. NOTE: even though some schools will elect to have some of these days as pupil free days, school zones will be in operation on all gazetted school days, whether students are present or not. Drive safely!

# <u>Student Leave Applications (for any leave other than</u> sick leave)

#### **Compulsory School Attendance**

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

# Requirements for Exemption from attendance for student absence and travel.

*1-5 days absence:* Parents must notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 week before leave date. If this travel is Overseas, and Application for Extended Leave form must be completed. Copies of travel document must be attached to Overseas Leave Applications.

5-100 day absence (whether travelling in Australian or Overseas): Parents must complete and submit the Application for Extended Leave form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave. (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application whether travelling in Australia or Overseas). If approved, the Principal will issue a Certificate of Extended Leave. It the principal declines this application (i.e. it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined will be forthcoming.

#### Enrolment for Year 1 to Year 6, 2019

St Bernadette's is still accepting applications for enrolment for 2019. Please pass this information on to any family and friends who may be interested in joining our community.

#### <u>Are you leaving SBD at the end of the year?</u>

Families of students in Kindergarten to Year 5 who are leaving our community at the end of the school year need to advise the school office in writing (if they haven't already) so that future grade numbers can be calculated and that any families on our waiting list can be contacted. Thank you for your understanding.
