Sunday, 26 May 2019: Sixth Sunday of Easter - Year C

REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

Some people have the idea that God is awfully remote, dwelling beyond the edge of the cosmos. We make contact by sending a prayer like a long range rocket, hoping it will find its target.

This is far distant from Our Lord's teaching in today's Gospel.

'If anyone loves me and keeps my word, my Father and I *will make our home* with that person.' It is not in *outer* space, but in *inner* space that Divine Love will make a home.

What turns a house into a home? It is in sitting around a table sharing a meal. So, Jesus created a sacred meal for us and invites us to share in the Heavenly Bread and Spiritual Drink.

When we do so, we find, in the words of St John Paul II, that we 'digest, as it were, the secret of the Resurrection'. We take into ourselves the Real Presence of the Risen Lord who makes his home with us.

Coming to Communion, even after a long time away, satisfies the yearning of the human heart because it is made to be the habitation of Divine Love. We could pause for a moment to reflect on the gracious fact that God chooses to dwell in our hearts. Let us respond wholeheartedly.

Safety First Please

Please make an appointment:

If you wish to see your child's teacher please make an appointment. Trying to see teachers when they are supposed to be in class is not appropriate.

Safety in drive thru:

Children are not going straight to the cars as it is not safe. Also please don't park at the front of the school and get out of your car as this constitutes parking and comes with a fine if you are caught.

Purchase of a new bike rack:

I have just purchased a bike rack with enough space for 6 bikes to start. However, children riding to school will need to have written parental permission and provide their own bike chains. I

will let you know of the start date once I have all of the permissions in place.

Children waiting in Cox Crescent:

It has come to my attention that a number of children are walking further around Cox Crescent and waiting to be picked up. This is a concern as they are unsupervised and potentially at risk. As I now know this they may come under my duty of care which is a risk that I am not prepared to take. This is an arrangement will no longer be an option unless I have a note outlining this arrangement with the person picking these students up, absolving the school of responsibility. The safety of your children is of the utmost importance to us.

LEARNING MATTERS

As a community of Learners:

Over the past two weeks as a staff we have had a number of great learning opportunities.

Literacy:

Our Staff Development Day was led by our Teacher Educator Mrs Lise Sercombe. During the course of the day we looked at the way our syllabus aligns with the literacy progressions. We also looked at ways to feedback to our students to assist them with their goal setting.

Numeracy

Our Learning in Numeracy has been around problem solving. Being able to design problems that are complex enough to challenge though not overwhelm can be tricky. Mr Kensell led the staff through a number of tasks which we can adapt and share with our students. A number of students have already come to show me their hard thinking. We maintain that while getting the answer correct is great, it's the solving that is fun.

A part of the PBS4L programme is for staff to be proactive in identifying places and procedures which may challenge some children's behaviour and to help prevent issues. As a result staff are regularly reviewing current practices and procedures and making small changes. If you have attended an assembly recently you would be familiar with the new dismissal procedure for assemblies. Now that we have a COLA another such procedural change is that children are lining up under the COLA after each bell. This has enabled students to get to their lines quicker and to line up easily. Though these changes are small they help to keep our children safe, respectful learners.



The focus for the next two weeks will be 'Before School' and 'Bus' procedures as well as 'We take responsibility for our decisions and actions'. So, with your support, we will be reminding the children to sit near the office if they arrive to school before 8:30 before moving down to the courts with the supervising teacher. For those who travel by bus we will be reminding them of public transport etiquette and safety. Of course, as parents, we try to teach our children to be honest and to own their behaviour and we will be supporting you at school by also teaching and modelling this in our lessons and everyday interactions with the students.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN Online

This year, for the first time, St Bernadette's completed NAPLAN online. Children from Years 3 & 5 sat tests in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions & Numeracy between Tuesday 14 May and Monday 20 May. There was also a catch up session on Tuesday 21 May for children who were absent on testing days.



The testing periods were very successful, with only very occasional interruptions due to minor technical issues. Due to the online testing (aside from Year 3 writing which was done on paper), the children were catered for with questions that suited their ability level. For example, if a child answered a series of questions successfully, the next set of questions would be of a more challenging nature. The same would apply if a child found a series of questions too difficult, where the next set of questions would be more accessible.

Results should provide both parents and educators with greater detail and be available earlier than in previous years.

The children from Year 3 & Year 5 are to be commended on the positive and sensible way they approached all of the assessments.
