Parent Teacher Interviews

Mathematics Grading for Semester One Reports

Now that all grades are working with a new mathematics syllabus, there have been some important changes to how grades are represented on semester reports. Previously, there were four focus areas reported on:

- Number & Algebra
- Measurement & Geometry
- Statistics & Probability
- Working Mathematically

The new syllabus has a strong central focus on Working Mathematically, which underpins all learning in the abovementioned focus areas. Due to this, there is no individual grade allocated by CSPD for Working Mathematically. Whilst this grade will not be present in your child's report, it is still a crucial area which your teacher observes and assesses progress in.

It is important to note that your child may not receive an overall grade indicative of the balance of the three grades received in Number & Algebra, Measurement & Geometry, as well as Statistics & Probability. This can be due to the Number & Algebra focus area being more significantly weighted. It could also be due to their performance when Working Mathematically affecting the overall grade.

For example, a child may receive B grades in Statistics & Probability, as well as Measurement & Geometry, whilst receiving a C grade in Number & Algebra. Should they be achieving at stage level for Working Mathematically and receive a C grade, they may receive an overall grading of C for Mathematics.

If you have concerns over this, your child's teacher can explain this in more detail at parent teacher interviews.

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Wellbeing at St Bernadette's

This term, some of our classes have been talking about emotional literacy. Emotional literacy is being able to talk about our emotions and how to deal with them. The classes have discussed how we all have emotions and that emotions are good, but what we do with our emotions is important. We have started to discuss how we can regulate our emotions so that we can be kind and respectful friends, while being a focussed learner. We will continue to talk about emotional literacy and how we can regulate our feelings. Keep an ear out for the words: zone of regulation. While we want to be calm and happy most of the time, we have discussed how it is okay to be in the red zone but we need to know how to not react and not hurt those around us. We will also start to explore empathy and keeping things in perspective throughout term 3.



These signs are found in our classrooms - they help us regulate our emotions and give us ideas as to what we can do when we are feeling some big emotions.

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time B GOSPEL

Mark 4:35-41

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

In 2020, Pope Francis stood alone in St Peter's Square in Rome and reflected on this Gospel passage. 'We find ourselves afraid and lost,' he said. 'Like the disciples in the Gospel we were caught off guard by an unexpected, turbulent storm.'

At the time, while a pandemic raged, the Pope spoke of the need for joint action for the good of all. 'We have realised that we are on the same boat, all of us fragile and disoriented,' he said, before adding that this meant we are 'all of us called to row together.'

Moreover, as the Pope reminds us, we never need to row alone. Jesus is always there for us when we call.

For the apostles, Jesus was in the boat. He was present, even as his disciples flailed about, worrying what would become of them. In fact, as the Pope notes, Jesus was 'in the stern, in the part of the boat that sinks first.' Whatever our trials, we should always know that Jesus is there with us.

And, the Pope adds, we can trust that Jesus understands. Tellingly, Jesus does not only calm the wind. As the Pope puts it, 'once they have called on him, he saves his disciples from their discouragement.'

Stage 3 Canberra Trip

In week 6, our stage 3 students were fortunate to be able to visit Canberra as part of their learning with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. This is an important excursion for our students who get first-hand experience of the democratic system and understand the process of voting and elections in our country. We were fortunate enough to meet our local Member of Parliament, Dr Andrew Charlton, who spoke to our children about the electorate of Parramatta. Some fun was also had with visits to the Dinosaur Museum and Questacon, where the children could be very hands-on in making discoveries about various elements of the scientific world.

This excursion is also made possible by financial assistance from the Australian Government through the PACER rebate. The Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) Program provides a travel subsidy for year 4–12 students across Australia to visit Parliament House, Old Parliament House and the Australian War Memorial and other national institutions as part of their civics and citizenship education. The PACER program is funded by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations. This rebate is \$30 per student and was deducted from the total cost of the overnight excursion.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff who came along on this excursion: Mrs Yager, Miss Steph, Miss Carly, Miss Leanne and Mr Kensell, as they give up a night away from their families and are on duty 24/7. It is a big responsibility to take students away overnight and they did so graciously.
