The Ascension of the Lord Year B

Gospel

Mark 16:15-20

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.

REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The Feast of the Ascension is really a kind of liminal moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times; a moment when we have left one place in our journey, but have not yet arrived at a second. While the narratives that describe the Ascension fit well into the unfolding story of redemption, the feast itself celebrates one aspect of the resurrection itself, namely, the exaltation of Jesus. The readings help us through this paradox. They allow us to focus on this theological point while we commemorate a turning point in the life of the church. We do this by considering both the enthronement of Christ in the heavens and the new body of Christ on earth.

Today we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at God's right hand. Today we are overwhelmed by the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity. Amidst shouts of joy and exaltation, Christ is enthroned in heaven in both his divinity and his glorified

humanity. Now he is present with us in a new way, in a new body, in the church. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists; he ministers through its prophets and pastors. Through us he continues to heal and to comfort; to forgive and to include. We have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have each other; together we make up the new body of Christ.



Attendance

Attendance rate: 75%- To unpack this a little more, this means that 75% of our students have an attendance rate of 90% -100%.

Lateness To School

It is a school requirement that when a student is late to school, a parent or carer is to walk the child into the school office to be signed in.

Enrolments for 2025

If you are looking at enrolling your child at our school for next year and have not yet contacted the school office for an application form, please do so as soon as possible as we have started the interview process.

Staff Development Day

Our next staff development day will be held on **Monday, 27 May** in week 5. This means that no children are to be at school on this day.

Reminder About Watches

A reminder that smart watches are **not** to be worn to school. They are expensive and can cause a distraction in class. If children are wearing these to school they will be treated like a mobile phone and be handed into the office once they come into school and they will be returned at the end of the day.

Winter Uniform Transition

From week 3 all students are to be wearing **full winter uniforms**. Below is a reminder of uniform requirements. Please be aware that there have been new additions to the girls' winter uniform

Girls' Winter Uniform

 Winter maroon and grey dress (knee length). Long sleeve sky blue blouse with maroon tab tie. Maroon jumper / cardigan with school crest. Long grey socks or stockings. Regulation black school shoes. An alternative option is a long sleeve sky blue blouse with a maroon tab tie and Maroon long pants. Maroon school hat / legionnaires cap with school crest. Regulation school bag with school crest.

Boys' Winter Uniform

 Grey regulation trousers. Long sleeved sky blue shirt. Maroon and blue pinstripe pre-loop school tie. Grey socks with maroon and sky blue striped band. Regulation black school shoes.
 Maroon school hat / legionnaires cap with school crest. Regulation school bag with school crest.

Hair Requirements

We are noticing that a few students are not following school requirements for hair. A reminder that hair of collar length and longer, should be tied back with maroon/blue ribbon, scrunchie or headband.

All haircuts should not be extremes of fashion (no buzzcuts, lines, spiking, rat's tails or zigzags and hair is not to be coloured for boys or girls).

If your child has braids in their hair, either temporary or permanent, they should not have bright coloured weaves or extensions. Hair must be of a natural colour.

St Bernadettes has had a variety of reward systems such as tokens, star jars and more. This year we are including a new reward to recognise individual student excellence. This is a new badge system - let me elaborate.

There are 4 main reward categories of which the students must show to earn said rewards. These are Safe, Respectful, Learner and Faith In Action.

If a student is displaying one of these qualities, they may receive a card from a teacher with the name of the action they have been performing. Once a child has 5 cards of the same category, they receive a certificate at the nearest assembly. When they receive 10 reward cards, they will receive a badge with the name of the reward category that they completed.

To complement the learning this term, the children will be experiencing coding each Tuesday afternoon, where they will apply what they have learned in their Monday science lessons in a practical context.


