RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: A Celebration of Mary's Journey to Heaven

The Feast of the Assumption, celebrated on August 15th, is a significant day in the Catholic Church, marking the belief that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken into heaven. This belief has deep roots in early Christian tradition, and has been expressed through centuries of devotion, art, liturgy and theology, becoming a cherished aspect of Catholic life.

Officially defined as Catholic doctrine in 1950, the Assumption highlights Mary's unique place in salvation history. For Catholics, the feast is a source of hope, reminding them of the promise of eternal life and the companionship with God that awaits after the trials of this life.

The Assumption also underscores Mary's role as a mother and sister in faith, someone who shares in our human experiences and hardships. Her life, from the joys of motherhood to the sorrow of witnessing her son's crucifixion, resonates deeply with the faithful, particularly women. As the Church honours Mary, it celebrates not just her Assumption, but her ongoing presence as a compassionate intercessor and model of Christian life.

In today's Church, the Feast of the Assumption continues to inspire hope and unity, reflecting Mary's deep connections to both God and humanity. It reminds all Catholics that, like Mary, we too are called to share in Christ's glory.

Gospel

John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the crowd:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven

Anyone who eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly,

if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood,

you will not have life in you.

Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life.

and I shall raise him up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food

and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me

and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father,

myself draw life from the Father,

so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

This is the bread come down from heaven;

not like the bread our ancestors ate:

they are dead,

but anyone who eats this bread will live forever.'



REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

'The Eucharist', Pope Francis famously said, 'is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak.' Reflecting on today's Gospel passage, the Pope encourages us to avoid becoming 'arbiters of grace'. Rather, he says, we should be 'its facilitators'.

As the Pope points out, Jesus gives us the Eucharist 'with a specific purpose: that we may become one with him.'

'The Eucharist is Jesus himself who gives himself entirely to us', the Pope reminds us, which helps us to become a living 'gift to God and to our brothers and sisters.'

In one sense, we do this individually. Being nourished by the Eucharist, the Pope explains, 'means entering into harmony with the heart of Christ, assimilating his choices, his thoughts, his behaviour.' Each of us therefore seeks to become what we consume.

But we do not do so alone. Communion is a celebration of the Body of Christ – the Church – which means we are being transformed together as the pilgrim People of God. Communion, the Pope says, 'means entering into a dynamism of love and becoming people of peace, people of forgiveness, of reconciliation, of sharing in solidarity.'

What this all means is that we should approach the Eucharist with openness to being changed, individually and collectively, into the Bread of Life for all.


FAITH IN ACTION: HELPING OTHERS TO SOAR IN 2024

RETURN AND EARN


