FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear St Bernadette's Parents and Carers,

Last week the new Religious Education Curriculum "Encountering Jesus" was launched, which will be available for use by our school communities from 2025. It is designed to enrich our students' spiritual journey and deepen their understanding of faith. The new Curriculum reflects the intention for all students to have a deep encounter with the person and message of Jesus Christ. For our students from Catholic families, this will serve to nurture and enrich their Catholic faith in support of their parents and carers as their first educators of faith. For our students from other religious perspectives, this encounter will help them grow in their knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith tradition, which is based on faith, hope and love.

As a curriculum developer I was part of the team that began the development of the new curriculum back in 2018. Today I feel a sense of excitement and pride that this important document will shape the lives of the students we teach and who they will become, by drawing them closer to God.

Last week, our school was alive with the magic of stories as we celebrated Book Week. The event was a vibrant celebration of literature, creativity, and the joy of reading. Students and staff dressed as beloved characters from books, adding colour and excitement to the school. We hosted a book fair, offering a wide range of titles to inspire young readers. The highlight of the week was a series of author visits and storytelling sessions both online and in person, that captivated the imagination of everyone involved. Book Week was a wonderful reminder of the power of reading to open minds and hearts.

We were pleased to host members of our School Board for a visit this week. Emeritus Professor Marea Nicholson AM - CSPD Board Director & Mission, Learning and People Committee and Fr Robert Reidling - CSPD Board Director & Episcopal Vicar for Education toured our classrooms and engaged with students and staff. The Board members expressed their admiration for the inspired work of our teaching staff and the enthusiasm of our students. Their visit was an important opportunity to gain firsthand experience of our school environment, which helps them make informed decisions that affect not only our students and staff but in the whole diocese. It signals that they are not just making decisions from a distance but are actively engaged in the education process.

We are incredibly proud of our students who competed in the Voice of Youth Public Speaking Competition last week. This annual event showcases the eloquence, confidence, and critical thinking skills of young speakers from across the cluster of local schools. Our students delivered compelling speeches on a variety of important topics, demonstrating not only their public speaking abilities but also their deep understanding of the issues they addressed. We congratulate Ella, Shane and Lily-Rose on their outstanding efforts. Ella was runner up and Lily-Rose was awarded the Social Justice medal.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Sunday 01 Sep 2024

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

Gospel

Mark 7:1-8. 14-15. 21-23

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the marketplace they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless,

the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man

that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'



REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

'You put aside the commandment of God,' warned Jesus, 'to cling to human traditions.' One of the sharpest lines in the Gospel, this is a watchword for every Christian generation.

'In today's passage,' Pope Francis says, 'Jesus addresses an important topic for all of us believers: the authenticity of our obedience to the Word of God, against any worldly contamination or legalistic formalism.'

As the Pope suggests, 'those challenging him seek to strike at the reliability and authority of Jesus as Teacher.' The religious leaders who questioned Jesus on technical points of ritual had deluded themselves about what was essential.

The Pope points out that 'Jesus wants to rouse the scribes and Pharisees from the error they have fallen into.' Christ's sharp words are intended to turn people from 'distorting God's will, neglecting his commandments in order to observe human traditions.'

'Today too,' the Pope reminds us, 'the Lord invites us to avoid the danger of giving more importance to form than to substance. He calls us to recognise, ever anew, what is the true core of the experience of faith, that is, love of God and love of neighbour.'



Rug Reading wrapped up our 2024 Book Week events. The community gathered together to soak up the sunshine reading their favourite stories.


